



# Preliminary Operating Statistics

## For the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2020

PT AirAsia Indonesia Tbk ("AAID" or "the Company") is pleased to announce the operating statistics for the third quarter of the financial year 2020 ("3Q20").

The Company posted a load factor of 49% for 3Q20, down by 36 percentage points ("ppt") as compared to the same period last year. The Company's operations have gradually picked up since resumption on 19th of June but remain below pre-COVID level. While passengers carried fell by 96% year-on-year ("YoY") to 73,905, it improved 1802% quarter-on-quarter ("Q-o-Q") as we resumed more flights and travel restrictions eased. The Company operated 12 routes during the quarter which include 5 international routes namely Kuala Lumpur-Jakarta, Surabaya-Kuala Lumpur, Kualanamu-Kuala Lumpur, Penang-Kualanamu and Kuala Lumpur-Lombok. The Company also operated 20 charter flights with a total of 5 aircraft being deployed for the quarter. Total fleet size remained unchanged at 28, 1 more than the same period last year.
